Local Study

Our Year Three children this term will be learning all about the United Kingdom and its cities. As well as zooming in and focusing on a local study of Maltby, particularly looking at its land use and population. We will be looking at how Maltby's land use and population have changed over time. During this term, the children will become experts of knowledge about their local area.



Learning Walk

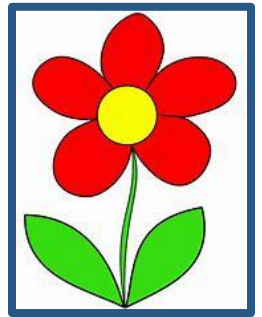
On the 24th January 2024, Year Three will be becoming geographers as we carrying out a local walk to carry out geographical fieldwork. The children will be able to see their local area, whilst looking particularly at the land use of the area.

Traffic Survey

On the 13th February 2024, Year 3 will be carrying out a traffic survey, as part of their local study learning journey this term.

Stay and Investigate

On the 12th January, Year 3 will be inviting parents to join us in our stay and investigate session. Parents can have the opportunity to come and work with their child to set up a scientific experiment, so the children can observe what requirements a plant needs to grow.



Project Homework

Our homework will be project based this year. Your child will bring home a '**Homework Menu**' with information about possible projects. The aim is to encourage your child to research and access homework for their own learning style. Your child will be expected to hand in one homework project every half term. Weekly Homework

In addition to the project-based homework, your child will receive weekly maths homework set on My Maths on a **Friday** and returned on a **Wednesday**. All maths homework will link to the learning for that week. Each week as your child returns their homework, they will receive a stamp on their chart which after 10 stamps will result in a reward.
