

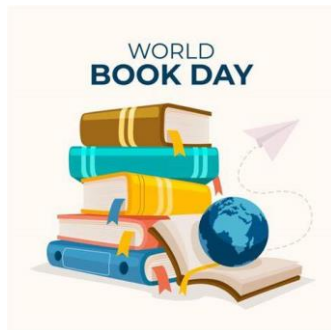
CURRICULUM NEWSLETTER

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This half term we would like you to complete the following learning projects at home:

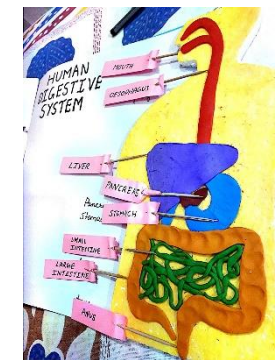
European Cities

Research a city located in Europe and create a fact file based on this place. You could include key information such as population, climate and popular landmarks and culture.



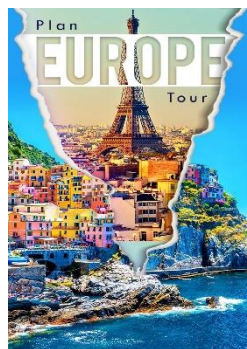
Disgusting digestion!
