History and Geography...

Throughout the term, we are continuing to alternate between history and geography,

In history we are still finding out about The Gunpowder Plot and why it is still significant today. We will be learning all about where, when and why it happened and the significance of the 5th November.

In geography we are building on what we have already found out about continents and oceans of the world. Our next focus will be to explore the similarities and differences between the continents and important facts and information about the oceans.

PE days

This year your child's PE days will be on Tuesday and Wednesday for **both classes**.

Please can you ensure that children bring their PE kits into school along with a change of appropriate footwear e.g., trainers.

Half-Termly Homework

Our homework will be project based throughout the year. The '**Homework Menu**' is on the back of this newsletter, and it includes information about possible projects. The aim is to encourage your child to research and access homework for their own learning style. Your child will be expected to hand in one homework project every half term. Weekly Homework

In addition to the project-based homework, it is requested that you read with your child on a regular basis – with the aim being that the child has read at home 3 x per week. This can be recording in their home-school diary which will be checked on a regular basis in class. As well as this, we send home a weekly spelling homework which links to the different spelling rules we have been learning over a two-week period.

We would like you to complete the following learning projects at home:

Choose a continent that you have learned about in class and create a fact file, book or poster outlining the wonderful, detailed facts about that place. This can be presented in any way which you choose.



Use a variety of different materials to create a 3D model of the world which clearly shows the different continents and oceans.



Research who Guy Fawkes was and why he is still significant today. Can you create a fact file or poster about Guy Fawkes? Include: when he was born, where he was born, what was he famous for and any other information about his life.



The choice of task is yours, choose wisely and we look forward to seeing your projects. If you need any help or advice on your project, just ask. It might be a good idea to ask your grown up to help you as well.
