Literacy

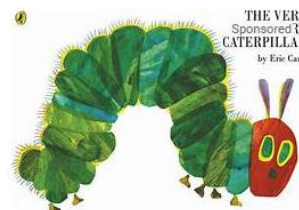
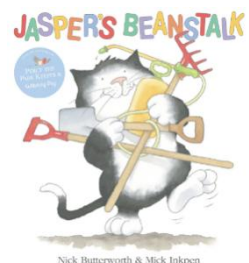
(Reading and Writing) We will explore the text Jaspers beanstalk and The very Hungry Caterpillar to deepen our understanding of the five key concepts of print and our phonological awareness. We will continue to recognise and write letters from our names. We will be introducing the children to RWInc phonics which includes the start off their letter sound knowledge.

Maths

We will Compare quantities using language: 'more than', 'fewer than'. We will talk about and identify the patterns around them. We will explore 2D and 3D shapes and discuss routes and locations, using words like 'in front of' and 'behind'.

Understanding the world

We will continue to explore the theme growing by care for growing plants as well as understand the key features of the life cycle of a plant and an animal. We will begin to understand the need to respect and care for the natural environment and all living things. We will talk about different forces they can feel.



Communication and Language Development

We will work on the ability to express a point of view and to debate when they disagree with an adult or a friend, using words as well as actions.

Expressive Arts and Design

We will use drawing to represent ideas like movement or loud noises. Show different emotions in their drawings and paintings, like happiness, sadness, fear, etc

Physical Development

Match their developing physical skills to tasks and activities in the setting. For example, they decide whether to crawl, walk or run across a plank, depending on its length and width. Continue to develop their movement, balancing, riding (scooters, trikes and bikes) and ball skills. Continue to work on a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will work on finding solutions to conflicts and rivalries. For example, accepting that not everyone can be Spider-Man in the game, and suggesting other ideas.

Helping your child at home

- Children will bring home a 'Reading for pleasure' book to share with you.
- Help your child with independence e.g. dressing/undressing, taking off and putting on their coat, going to the toilet independently, hand washing etc
- Continue to talk about everything - their day at school, their favourite toys, food, anything!
