Dear Parents and Carers

RE: Y6 Residential Trip

Please find attached the kit list for the upcoming residential trip, which will take place from Monday 8th June to Wednesday 10th June at the new location of Bewerley Park Centre for Outdoor Education.

Children should arrive at school at the normal time on Monday 8th June. We will be departing at approximately 9:15am. On Wednesday 10th June, we will be leaving Bewerley Park at around 1:30pm and expect to return (traffic dependent) at the usual home time or shortly after. Any updates during the trip will be communicated via Seesaw.

Please note that children will need to bring a packed lunch on the first day, as lunch will not be provided. In addition, all children must bring a reusable water bottle that they can use throughout the duration of the trip. We ask that children do not bring any mobile devices on the residential. This is to encourage them to fully engage in the experience, enjoy the activities, and spend quality time with their peers without distractions. We are also not allowing any money to be brought on the trip. Within reason, children may bring a small selection of snacks; however, items containing nuts, fizzy drinks, or excessive sugary products are not permitted and will be confiscated.

All medical forms must be completed and returned no later than Friday 29th May. The link for the form has been sent via Seesaw to all parents. Any medication, including travel sickness tablets, must be accompanied by a completed form. Medication should be clearly labelled with the child's name, dosage, and frequency. Medical Administration forms are available from the school office. If medication is required on the Monday morning before arrival, it should be prepared in a separate, clearly labelled bag or box and handed directly to the teacher upon arrival at school.

Kit List - Bewerley Park

The courses at the centre involve a lot of time outdoors whatever the weather, and there is a likelihood of clothes getting wet. Summer or winter conditions will dictate a different amount to be brought, but old hard-wearing warm clothes are required.

Clothing for activities	
2-3 pairs of walking/thick socks (not trainer socks)	
2- 3 long sleeved fleeces or sweaters	
Waterproof jacket or coat	
Warm waterproof gloves, hat and scarf (depending on season)	
Swimming wear (useful under a wetsuit)	
2-3 warm shirts, T shirts or thermal tops	
2 pairs of trainers, 1 for normal use, 1 old pair for wet activities	
2- 3 pairs of trousers, tracksuit bottoms are ideal ((jeans are not suitable for activities)-We recommend sending old clothes as they will get wet/dirty	

Other essentials	
Several changes of underwear	
Socks (not for activities)	
2 good sized towels	
Wash kit/ toiletries – please note that aerosol deodorants are not allowed	
Pyjamas or night clothes	
1 or 2 sets of casual clothes for social activities	
Packed lunch for the first day	
Reusable water bottle	

Other useful items	
Books/Playing cards	
Sun cream/ sun hat in summer	
Bin liner for wet/smelly clothes	
Small backpack for day to day	
Flip flops (for shower)	

Students are asked to make sure that wherever possible their name is on their clothing and personal possessions.
