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#### Curriculum plan

**Communication and Language Development** We will be sharing lots of traditional tales throughout this half term in which the children will be encouraged to develop social phrases and retell them in the role play/small world areas.

**Physical Development** In PE we will be joining in with Maltby Academy sports activities to help us develop our gross motor skills. We will also be developing our pincer grip when using writing tools.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development We will be developing our selfconfidence and self-awareness when trying bread this half term. We will also be exploring what it means to be kind with our friends in Foundation Stage. Literacy (Reading and Writing) We will share many traditional tales, including 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and 'The Little Red Hen'. We will also be taking part in daily Read Write Inc phonics sessions.

Maths We will be continuing to investigate numbers and understand their value. We will then be focussing on 1 more/1 less than a number.

**Understanding the World**, We will be learning about how things change, such as the beanstalk in Jack and the Beanstalk. We will link this to the lives and occupations of different people e.g., farmers. We will also be continuing with our Forest School learning.

**Expressive Arts and Design** We will be learning how to make bread and seeing how the ingredients change uses vocabulary such as kneed, prove and bake

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### Helping your child at home

- Please continue to write in your child's record each time you read with them. For every three reads they will receive a sticker on their new bookmark.
- Help your child to write their full name and practise recognising numbers to 10 and beyond in different environments.
- Talk about everything- their day at school, their favourite toys, food, anything!
