Our current learning journey is: 'Why is Bonfire Night significant?'

#### The Gunpowder Plot

As part of our learning journey this half term, we will be aiming to answer our overarching inquiry question 'Why is Bonfire Night significant?'. To answer this, we will become historians and learn about the history behind Bonfire Night – more specifically, about The Gunpowder Plot and Guy Fawkes. We will be learning about who Guy Fawkes was and what happened in the 1600s. The children will develop their learning by enquiring about what the plot was, how it failed and what happened as a consequence.

#### **Project Homework**

There are a selection of ideas for different projects your child may like to complete this half term. On Class DoJo and overleaf you will see a 'Homework Menu' with information linking to our new learning journey. The aim is to encourage your child to research and access homework for their own learning style. Your child will be expected to hand in one homework project every half term. #### **Exceptional Experiences**

This half term we have two very exciting opportunities for the children which we are looking forward to immensely!

On **Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> November** you are invited to come to school for our 'Stay and Make' session where the children will make their own Guy Fawkes.

### **Weekly Homework**

In the front of their planners, the children will have spellings from their individual spelling groups that they can work on at home. Then, every Friday your child's class teacher will set a Maths activity on MyMaths (your child has their own login for in their planner). Finally, teachers will check planners weekly to see how often the children have read at home – if they have read three times in a week, they will get a sticker and once they have 10 stickers, they will earn a star on their chart.
