When these are confirmed, we will send out communication to parents about the clubs to enable you to sign up. Remember this is on a first come, first served basis and I apologise that some children have been disappointed this time around.

Our first Parent's Open Evening is scheduled to take place on Tuesday 18th October but we operate an open door policy where you can come in and speak to one of us at any time about any concerns and worries.
