<u>Friday 14th July</u> – Summer Fayre (Organised by Year 6 Children)



Mrs Cresswell's favourite book is....



Attendance

Good attendance at school is essential so that children can reach their full potential. As we good attendance, we rewarding children who come to school on time each day. Attendance Ted and Attendance Teddy are rewarded each Friday to the class in school who had the best attendance during the week. They then get to spend the week with the children and join in with their learning – Attendance Ted has even been to Bamburgh on residential with Year 5! Each week, the children who have had 100% attendance have their names put into a raffle draw and on the last Friday of the term, a name is pulled out for a child in EYFS/KS1 and KS2 to win their own Attendance Teddy and Attendance Ted. This is a reward which is highly treasured by the children who have received it so far during their time at Manor.





Keeping Your Children Safe

As the nights are becoming lighter, our children are playing out at after school and we feel it is important to raise parents' awareness of risks to our children in the community. There is a culture at the moment where young children are being targeted by gangs and then become involved in Child Criminal Exploitation. This is when children, sometimes as young as 8 years old, are manipulated to commit crimes (such as burglary), carry weapons and/or hold/sell drugs. County Lines is the most common activity in our area, and this is where drugs are distributed from cities into smaller towns by children. Signs to watch out for include:- not being home on time or going missing for short periods of time, not hanging out with their usual friends, becoming involved in anti-social behaviour or even having new clothes or phones which they cannot explain. Please keep a watch out for your children and know what they are doing when not at home so that we can keep them safe.
